Do any of the following apply to your situation?

- “A teacher reported my child’s bruises. Now the Children’s Aid Society has called me to investigate.”
- “My ex-partner is always late with or misses his/her child support payments.”
- “I’m on social assistance and I’m worried that child support payments will affect my benefits.”
- “My ex-partner keeps changing the time he/she will pick up our kids.”
- “I’m worried about my child spending time alone with my ex-partner because he/she was abusive when we lived together.”
- “I have to stay home to take care of our kids, but my ex-partner won’t pay spousal support.”
- “I was married in a religious ceremony in my home country but want to get a divorce so I can remarry in Canada.”
- “I sponsored my partner to immigrate to Canada. Because we are not married and haven’t lived together for over a year, the application was refused.”
